


### Death toll: (official) 379 (unofficial) 1000 +, 2000 wounded





# Chandrashekhar (Tiwari) "Azad"


1906 - 1931 Mentor of Bhagat Singh, co-founder of Hindustan Socialist Republican Association (HSRA)



# **Bhagat Singh**

1907-1931

- Joins Non-Cooperation Movement, 1920 (age 13)
- Co-founds Hindustan Socialist Republican Association
- Simon Commission visits Lahore, October 1928; clubbing death of Lala Lajpat Rai (age 63)
- Revenge killing of Deputy Supt. Of Police
   J. P. Saunders by Bhagat, Rajguru, and Sukhdev




- April, 1929, bombs, leaflets in Legislative Assembly;
   "Inquilab Zindabad!"
   ("Long live the revolution!")
- Hunger strike for 63 days in prison

### Hanged on March 23, 1931, with Rajguru and Sukhdev



"Let us declare that the state of war does exist and shall exist so long as the Indian toiling masses and the natural resources are being exploited by a handful of parasites. They may be purely British Capitalist or mixed British and Indian or even purely Indian. They may be carrying on their insidious exploitation through mixed or even on purely Indian bureaucratic apparatus. All these things make no difference. ....."

"It is easy to kill individuals, but you cannot kill ideas." Bhagat Singh






