
### **Commodore's Corner**

We are incredibly **grateful** to all of our supporters and donors for enabling a successful season and allowing the club and team to thrive. As you all know, we were not able to compete in regattas for several seasons due to COVID-19 and related restrictions. This was our first spring regatta season since 2019, and it went very well! We competed throughout New England over the course of the semester.
